About Uni Link

General requirements

Apart from the specific academic requirements for each course, the general requirements for Uni Link's programs include:

- Applicants must be aged 16 or above at the commencement of the Study Tour program.
- High-level of English language and comprehension skills are required to complete the course, IELTS 5.5 or equivalent is recommended.

Important notes

- Micro-credential courses can be customised upon a special request of a group of a minimum 20 students, and this is subject to Uni Link's availability.
- The program can be run any time of the year, but there is more availability during the UWA semester breaks (Jun-Jul / Dec-Feb).

WHAT IS A MICRO-CREDENTIAL?

Micro-credentials are short courses that target specific skills. They utilize interactive and collaborative learning methods, making the experience engaging and centred around the needs of the students.

WHAT IS A PD POINT?

Students who successfully complete a course at UWA Uni Link earn Professional Development Points (PD Points). Each PD Point reflects the workload associated with undertaking micro-credentials and is equivalent to 25 hours of effort, encompassing contact hours, personal study, and assessments or examinations.

Winter School Study Program for Medical and Health Sciences

<< This program is exclusively for particular UWA partner universities and runs in July and August only >>

Overview

The Winter School Study Program was established in 2010 with the objective of offering international students studying to become health professionals an opportunity to experience the Australian healthcare system, along with medical research methodology, research ethics, and scientific writing skills.

Content

The program consists of one week of lectures and workshops, followed by three weeks of coursework or research. Allocation of coursework and research will be at a 1:1 ratio.

You'll gain

- Understanding of the Australian healthcare system
- Skills in basic and clinical research
- Insight into what is required to undertake postgraduate research at UWA.

Part 1: Lectures and Workshops (week 1)

Students undertake specialised lectures and workshops on the healthcare system in Australia; patient communication skills; medical research methodology; research ethics; and scientific writing skills. Part 1 is a prerequisite for the coursework and research in Part 2.

Part 2: Coursework or Research (weeks 2-4)

During this period, students will be assigned to either coursework or research based on their academic level.

Coursework: Mechanisms of Human Diseases

Eligible: First- and second-year undergraduate medical students will undertake a three-week lecture program focused on the mechanisms of human diseases.

Research: Medical Research: Techniques and Experiences

Eligible: Third-year undergraduates with a research background or postgraduate medical students will undertake a three-week supervised research project in UWA labs.

Note: Except 1st and 2nd year undergraduate students, all applicants must attend an online meeting for assessment of English proficiency and academic background for module allocation. It includes questions on students' interest in medical topics and prior lab experience to determine module suitability and potential supervisors.

Assessment

- Coursework students will be assessed through a written exam.
- Research students will deliver an oral presentation of their research project.
- Both coursework and research students will participate in case discussions and class debates.



Professor Minghao Zheng

Professor Zheng is the course coordinator of the Winter School Program and delivers lectures on various topics.

About Minghao Zheng

Minghao Zheng is Professor of Orthopaedic Research at the University of Western Australia and heads the Bone-Brain Axis research division at the Perron Institute for Neurological and Translational Science in Perth. After studying medicine at Shantou University and Sun Yat-sen University of Medical Sciences in China, Professor Zheng received a PhD (1993) and Doctor of Medicine (2000) from UWA.

Professor Zheng is an expert in the field of regenerative medicine, particularly the translation of novel science into clinical practice, including the regeneration of tendon and cartilage using a patient's own stem cells. He developed Matrix-induced Autologous Implantation (MACI) for cartilage repair of the adult knee, and Autologous Tenocyte Implantation therapy (Ortho-ATI™) for chronic tendon injuries. His research has produced collagen scaffold medical devices for cartilage, tendon and ligament (CelGro™), dental (Striate+™), and nerve repair (Remplir™) applications. Recent work has focussed on mitochondrial transfer in tissue homeostasis, and mechanobiology of subcellular organelles in neurological diseases and exercise.

Professor Zheng is co-founder of Orthocell Limited (ASX:OCC), a company established to commercialise orthopaedic innovations; and established Marine Biomedical Pty Ltd to develop PearlBone™ from pearl nacre into a synthetic bone substitute for the orthopaedic device sector.

He has authored more than 330 scientific publications with over 14,660 citations and H index of 68 and holds 11 patent families in orthopaedics and cellular therapy worldwide.

Professor Minghao Zheng was elected a Fellow of the Australian Academy of Health and Medical Sciences (AAHMS) in October 2025, recognising his outstanding contributions to health and medical research in Australia.

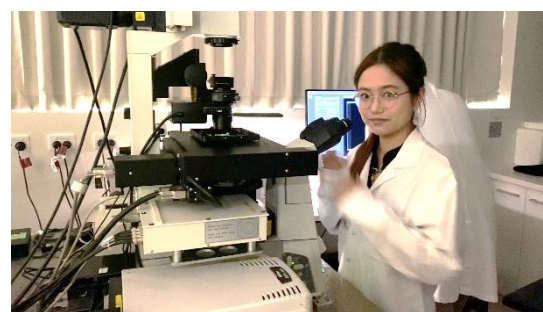

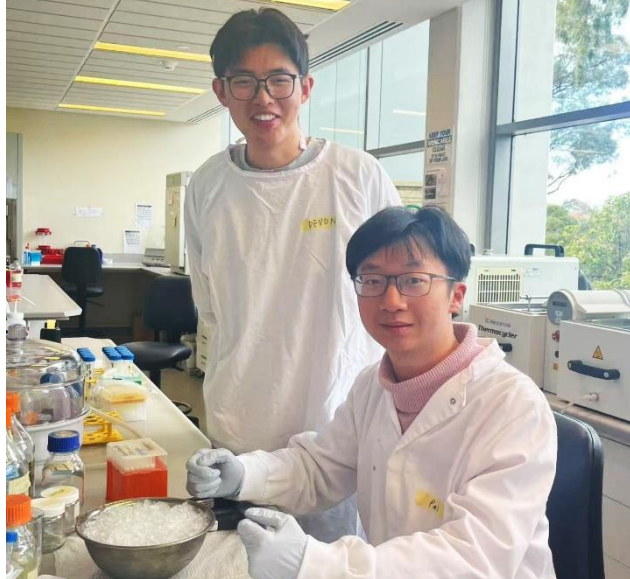

- Students will be allocated to Modules (coursework or research) depending on their academic background and English language ability.

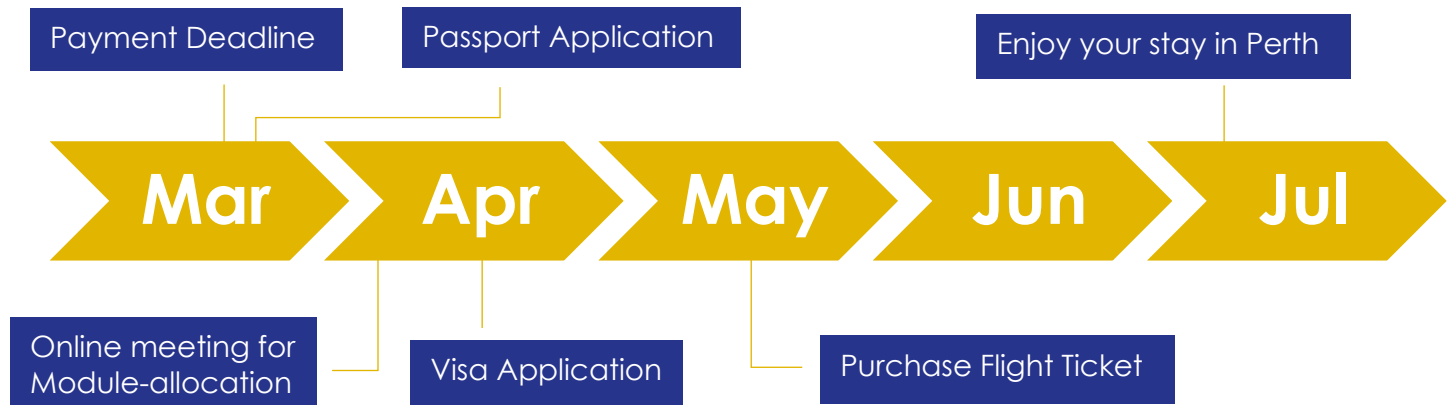

Terms & Conditions (Group)

General

- At least one responsible adult (chaperone) must accompany the group.
- Participants acknowledge they were provided with comprehensive information regarding program details, including but not limited to course requirements, fees, facilities and services, prior to submitting their application.
- Classes may be combined with other groups or participants, depending on the UWA School's decision regarding class arrangements. If alternative arrangements are requested, additional fees may apply.
- All scheduled activities will be delivered. However, Uni Link reserves the right to modify the order of activities to suit timetables and availability. In the event of inclement weather or unforeseen circumstances, activities may be substituted. Any significant changes will be discussed with the chaperone(s) as needed.
- Requests to change arrangements after booking are subject to approval and may incur additional fees.
- Joining the program after it has commenced is not permitted.
- No refunds will be provided for participants who choose not to attend any class or activity during the program.
- UWA professional development transcript and certificate will only be issued to participants who successfully pass the micro-credential course.
- Flight details need to be provided at least 4 weeks prior to departure for arrangements.
- Photos and videos taken or provided during/for the program will be used for marketing and promotional purposes.

Information and Privacy

- All information provided to Uni Link should be complete, accurate, and up to date. Participants understand that incomplete or outdated information and documentation may result in an unsuccessful application.
- Providing false or misleading information or documentation may lead to cancellation of participation in the program without a refund.
- Participants authorise Uni Link to make bookings and arrangements on their behalf for the purpose of delivering the program. This includes disclosing relevant information to third parties (such as accommodation providers, activity operators, and educational institutions) as necessary for the successful planning and execution of the program.

Group Size

A minimum number of participants is required for the program to proceed. If the final number of participants is lower than the proposed number, please notify Uni Link as early as possible to request a revised proposal.

Accommodation

- Participants must adhere to the accommodation provider's rules and guidelines. Failure to comply may result in fines or penalties issued by the provider.
- Single bed size is the standard across all accommodations. Special requests (e.g., larger bed sizes or other arrangements) must be made in advance, are subject to availability, and may incur additional charges.
- Unless specified, bathrooms may be shared in your accommodations. Personal hygiene items (including but not limited to toothbrushes, body wash, slippers, hair dryers) may not be provided.
- Same-sex arrangements will apply to shared room/placement accommodation. Additional charges may apply for single occupancy in rooms designated for shared use.
- Room upgrades are subject to availability and may incur additional fees.
- Modifications are not permitted once rooming arrangements have been confirmed.

- Standard group check-in time is 14:00, and check-out time is 10:00. Early check-in or late check-out is subject to approval and may incur additional charges.

For Homestay Accommodation

- Participants with special dietary requirements may incur additional fees to cover the cost of meals provided by homestay hosts (e.g., halal, gluten-free, vegan, kosher, vegetarian).
- Special requests will strive to be accommodated, but please note that all requests are subject to availability and cannot be guaranteed.
- **Please understand that homestays are not hotels and families have their own personal schedules, habits and culture. Generally speaking, check-in / check-out are not expected between 20:30 and 10:00.**

Meals

- Dining times are determined by the accommodation or meal provider. Standard dining times are as follows: Breakfast: 07:00 – 09:00 / Lunch: 12:00 – 14:00 / Dinner: 18:00 – 20:00
- Meal offerings are at the discretion of the provider. Each meal consists of one serving.
- If you have specific dietary requirements or require special meal arrangements, please inform the Uni Link Team at the time of booking. All special arrangements are subject to availability and may incur additional charges.

Transportation

- If included in the program, a preloaded amount will be credited to each participant's SmartRider (a public transportation card used in Perth). Participants may top up their cards if additional credit is needed. The minimum recharge amount is AUD 10.
- SmartRiders must be returned to Uni Link at the end of the program and the remaining balance will not be refunded. Participants who wish to keep the SmartRider may do so by paying AUD 10. If the card is lost or damaged, a replacement fee of AUD 10 will apply, and the remaining balance from the previous card cannot be transferred.
- Due to the busy traffic situation in the CBD area, if both the destination and accommodation are within the [Free Transit Zone](#), public transportation may be used instead.

Loss & Insurance

- All participants are required to arrange their own comprehensive travel insurance covering the entire duration of their travel period prior to departure from their home country.
- Participants are solely responsible for any expenses, losses, injuries, damages, or inconveniences incurred by themselves during the program. Uni Link and its partners will not be held liable for such incidents.

Booking and Payment

- A minimum deposit of 50% of the program fee per participant is required at the time of application to secure the booking. This deposit is non-refundable. The remaining balance must be paid at least 8 weeks before the program start date.
- Group payment is preferred for ease of processing.
- Uni Link does not cover any bank charges or surcharges associated with the payment. These are the responsibility of the payer.
- All fees listed are inclusive of 10% Goods and Services Tax (GST).

Force Majeure

In the event of circumstances beyond Uni Link's reasonable control that affect the delivery of the program, no refunds will be provided, and Uni Link will not be held responsible for any resulting loss, delay, or disruption. Any refunds or compensation will be subject to the terms and coverage of each participant's own comprehensive travel insurance.

Examples of such events include, but are not limited to:

- Severe weather conditions or natural disasters;
- War, civil unrest, or acts of terrorism;
- Government-imposed restrictions or lockdowns;
- Widespread illness, including epidemics or pandemics.

Substitutions

One participant substitution is permitted per group and must be requested no later than 8 weeks prior to the program start date. Additional charges may apply due to gender balance considerations and rooming arrangements.

Cancellations

- Cancellation must be submitted in writing by completing a Withdrawal and Refund Form. A cancellation is not considered effective until the form is received and acknowledged by Uni Link.
- Uni Link will not cover any bank charges, surcharges, or currency exchange differences incurred during the refund process.
- In the event of a cancellation, refunds will be processed according to the table below:

For the visa refusal situation only

For the July 2026 cohort, students who have applied and paid for the Micro-credentials course - Winter School Study Program for Medical and Health Sciences and whose visa application is refused by the Australian Government can withdraw from the program and request a refund, subject to the following documentation being submitted within 3 days of receiving the refusal.

- Official visa refusal letter from the Department of Home Affairs
- Proof of original visa application submission

Refund of the program fee will be based on the following.

- Withdrawal more than 30 days before the start date of the program
The refund amount will be the total program fee paid, minus an AUD 110 administrative fee.
- Withdrawal 1 - 30 days before the start date of the program
 1. If no accommodation is chosen:
The refund amount will be the total program fee paid, minus an AUD 110 administrative fee.
 2. If homestay accommodation is chosen:
 - The refund amount will be the total program fee paid, minus an AUD 110 administrative fee and AUD 385 homestay fee, if it's 9 or more days before arrival
 - The refund amount will be the total program fee paid, minus an AUD 110 administrative fee and AUD 860 homestay fees, if it's 4-8 days before arrival
 - The refund amount will be the total program fee paid, minus an AUD 110 administrative fee and AUD 1450 other fees, if it's 1-3 days before arrival

3. If short-term student accommodation is chosen:
 - The refund amount will be the total program fee paid, minus an AUD 110 administrative fee, and AUD 110 accommodation fee, if it's 8 or more days before arrival
 - The refund amount will be the total program fee paid, minus an AUD 110 administrative fee and AUD 680 other fees, if it's 1-7 days before arrival
 4. If hotel accommodation is chosen:
 - The refund amount will be the total program fee paid, minus an AUD 110 administrative fee, and AUD 310 accommodation fee, if it's 8 or more days before arrival
 - The refund amount will be the total program fee paid, minus an AUD 110 administrative fee, and AUD 780 other fee, if it's 1-7 days before arrival
- Withdrawal less than 1 day before arrival or after program commencement - no refund will be provided.

In the event of any disputes, the decision of UWA Uni Link shall be final and binding
